Supplementary Regulations: Touring Assembly

1. Announcement

The Light Car & Edwardian Section of the Vintage Sports Car Club Limited will organise a Certificate of Exemption Touring Assembly on Saturday 27th March 2010. The event will start and finish at the Metropole Hotel, Temple Street, Llandrindod Wells, Powys (MR 147/061611).

2. Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (including the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the

3. Authorisation

MSA Certificate of Exemption

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4. Eligibility

The event is open to all fully paid-up members of both the organising club and the Light Car & Edwardian Section, driving cars that are accepted by the Section.

5. Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering will be available on Friday 26th March from around 3.00 p.m. at the Metropole. Scrutineering and Signingon will then open at the Metropole at 9.00 a.m. on Saturday 27th March. Any competitor who has not passed Scrutineering and Signing-on by 11.30 a.m. may be excluded. Cars will leave the start from mid-morning onwards – precise timings will be detailed in the Final Instructions – and will complete the Touring Assembly route. Competitors who have not returned their Score Card to the finish by 6.30 p.m. may be excluded.

6. Route

The total route is 57.2 miles. A map will be provided, with the route marked, and straightforward route instructions of the 'turn left, turn right' variety will be given. For those who wish to bring their own maps, the route is contained on Ordnance Survey Landranger 1:50,000 Maps 147 Elan Valley and Builth Wells (any edition) and 148 Presteigne & Hay-on-Wye (any edition).

7. Classes

There will be no Classes in this event

8. Technical Regulations

All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical regulations and with the VSCC's 'Eligibility of Cars (2007)' leaflet (or subsequent) and the requirements of the Light Car and Edwardian Section of the VSCC.

All competing cars must be taxed (displaying the appropriate tax disc) and insured for use on the public highway. Insurance cover must include usage on this event. All cars must be in possession of a current and valid MOT certificate (or the accompanying sticker provided it is clean and readable) and this, as well as the tax disc, or other national equivalent

documents, must be presented to the Scrutineers for inspection. **No show, no go, no exceptions.** It is recommended but not mandatory that cars be equipped with a working fire extinguisher, which should be firmly secured.

9. Awards

First, Second and Third class awards appropriate to the number of starters will be awarded. The results of the event will also count towards the Llwynbarried Trophy for the best overall performance across the Weekend (in combination with the Sporting Trial).

10. Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on **Friday 12**th **March 2010**. The entry fee is £20 per car. If under 30 years old, the entry fee is £14. Note that a discounted fee is available if the Sporting Trial is also entered – see the Entry Form for details.

Supplementary Regulations SPORTING TRIAL

1. Announcement

The Light Car & Edwardian Section of the Vintage Sports Car Club Limited will organise a Clubsport Permit Sporting Trial on Sunday 28th March 2010. The event will start from the Metropole Hotel, Temple Street, Llandrindod Wells, Powys (MR 147/061611). The finish location will be detailed in the Final Instructions.

2. Jurisdiction

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of the Motor Sports Association (including the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these Supplementary Regulations and any written instructions the organising Club may issue for the event.

3. Authorisation

MSA Clubsport Permit

4. Eligibility

The event is open to all fully paid-up members of both the organising club and the Light Car & Edwardian Section, driving cars that are accepted by the Section.

5. Programme of the Meeting

Scrutineering will be available on Friday 26th March from around 3.00 p.m. at the start/finish venue. Scrutineering and Signing-on will then open at the start/finish venue at 9.00 a.m. on Saturday 27th March, and again at 8.00 a.m. on Sunday 28th March. Any competitor who has not passed Scrutineering and Signing-on by 10.00 a.m. on Sunday may be excluded. The first hills will open at 9.00 a.m. Competitors who have not returned their Score Card to the finish by 1.30 p.m. may be excluded.

6. Route

Public roads will be used to link sections. There is no competitive mileage on any public right of way. Ordnance Survey Landranger 1:50,000 Map 147 Elan Valley and Builth Wells (any edition) will be required. Details of the hill locations, any route to be followed, and any running order for the hills will be issued at Signing-on.

7. Classes

Class 1: Edwardian cars.

Class 2: Light cars with differentials.Class 3: Light cars without differentials.

8. Technical Regulations

All vehicles must comply with MSA Technical regulations and with the VSCC's 'Eligibility of Cars (2002)' leaflet (or subsequent) and the requirements of the Light Car and Edwardian Section of the VSCC.

In addition:

J.58 (tyres). Well-based tyres on the driven wheels must have a tread pattern such that the blocks are

- not more than 10mm deep, nor more than 10mm apart laterally or circumferentially. There must not be an uninterrupted lateral gap between the side blocks. Off Road, Trail or Enduro tyres are not eligible.
- Special grip, knobbly or hand cut tread tyres are not allowed. Note: Tyres with bolts or screws penetrating the side walls or beads are illegal and will not be allowed; neither will operational security bolts. Specifically 3.50 x 19 INOUE tyres are not permitted.

All competing cars must be taxed (displaying the appropriate tax disc) and insured for use on the public highway. Insurance cover must include usage on this event. All cars must be in possession of a current and valid MOT certificate (or the accompanying sticker provided it is clean and readable) and this, as well as the tax disc, or other national equivalent documents, must be presented to the Scrutineers for inspection.

No show, no go, no exceptions.

All cars must be equipped with a working fire extinguisher, (Halon/BCF is not allowed) which must be firmly secured.

9. Awards

Awards will be presented as follows:

- Named trophies: Winifred Boddy Memorial Trophy for the best performance by a competitor who has not previously won an award on the Sporting Trial; Kate Hutchings Memorial Trophy for the best performance by a competitor aged under 26.
- First, Second and Third class awards appropriate to the number of starters in each class.

Named trophies to be held for one year, others to be retained.

The results of the event will also count towards the Llwynbarried Trophy for the best overall performance across the Weekend (in combination with the Touring Assembly).

10. Entries

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and closes finally on **Friday 12**th **March 2010**. The entry fee is £24 per car. If under 23 years old, the entry fee is £17. Note that a discounted fee is available if the Touring Assembly is also entered – see the Entry Form for details.

SAFETY, HEALTH, ENVIRONMENT AND FIRE (SHEF) AT THE VINTAGE SPORTS CAR CLUB (VSCC) AND DURING VSCC EVENTS

The VSCC Policy Statement

The Directors and trustees of The Vintage Sports-Car Club (VSCC or The Club) recognise and wholeheartedly accept their moral and legal obligations and responsibilities with regard to health, safety and the environment.

It is the Policy of the VSCC to operate in a positive culture of safety, health and environmental protection throughout its entire business and sporting activities. To this end the Club will coordinate all relevant activities under the collective heading of Safety, Health, Environment and Fire or 'SHEF'.

It is the policy of the VSCC to take all reasonably practicable steps to:

- Provide adequate control of the health, safety and environmental risks arising from our activities;
- Consult with our employees on matters affecting their health and safety;
- Provide and maintain safe plant and equipment;
- Ensure safe handling and use of substances;
- Provide information, instruction and supervision of employees;
- Ensure all employees are competent to do their tasks, and to give them adequate training;
- Prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health;
- Maintain safe and healthy working conditions;
- Protect the health and safety of others who may be affected by our activities;
- Deal with waste and pollution in an environmentally responsible manner;
- Review and revise this policy as necessary at regular intervals.

In pursuance of this policy the Club will progressively identify all hazards, assess the risks and take measures to reduce risk. Motor sport is spectacular and exciting, providing enjoyment to competitors and spectators alike but there are many aspects of the sport which carry inherent risks. These risks cannot be totally eliminated and emphasis must therefore be placed on controlling the risks through effective risk management systems. The purpose of such Risk Management will be elimination of the risk where possible or reduction of the risks So Far As is Reasonably Practicable (SFARP) where it cannot.
